Land Use Impacts in the Shoreland Zone -a continuation of the Mississippi River Renaissance (MRR) Project

This fall workshop features an interactive bus tour that focuses on land use impacts in the shoreland of the River corridor. Participants from the spring workshop specifically identified high interest in more education about shoreland property practices, land use impacts and challenges, and stewardship and management decision options.

Objectives of this workshop are:

- **Build** an increased understanding of concepts of “shoreline”, the “shoreland zone”, and the “river corridor” and the regulations that units of government use to manage these.
- **Observe** the problems and challenges of multiple land uses in the shoreland and in the corridor.
- **Equip** your community’s “toolbox” with practices and policies you may want to consider.
- **Discuss** goals your community and the collective communities in the Renaissance Project region could identify and work on together.

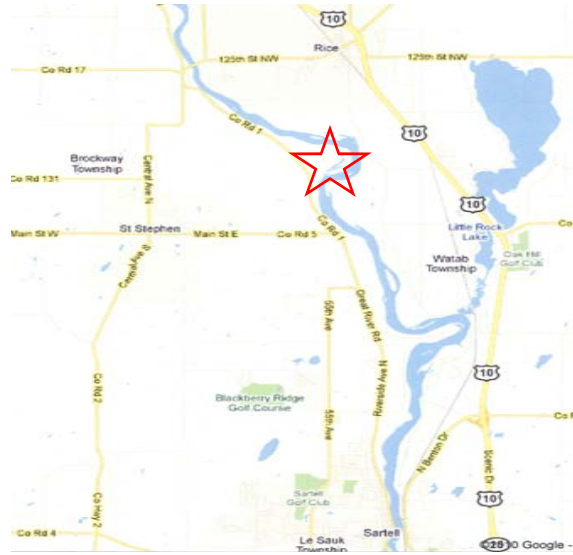
